

Elk Street at Sussex Street Pedestrian Safety Improvements

District 8 Supervisor Scott Weiner and the community have requested for pedestrian safety improvements at the intersection of Elk Street at Sussex Street. Below are options that SFMTA staff are currently reviewing.

Background Information:

- T-intersection with STOP control on the stem of the T at Sussex Street
- No collisions in the past five years
- Average daily traffic of 6,520 vehicles per day on Elk Street
- 30 mph per hour speed limit north of the intersection (85th percentile speed measured at 29 mph)

Pros Cons

Pedestrian Crossing Signs



Advance warning ahead of and at crossing points

Dependent on driver behavior and compliance

Cost: Low | Timeframe: Short | Effectiveness: Low

All-Way STOP Control



- Clear right of way assignment for all users
- Assists with managing poor sight lines
- Does not meet the traffic or pedestrian volumes or collision history to warrant a STOP sign
- Impacts 6,000+ vehicles per day

Cost: Low | Timeframe: Short | Effectiveness: Medium

Bulbouts with All-Way STOP Control

- Increases pedestrian visibility
- Shortens crossing distances
- Visually narrows the roadway
- May reduce vehicle speeds
- Clear right of way assignment for all users
- Assists with managing poor sight lines
- Parking removal
- Street grade may limit benefits
- Does not meet the traffic or pedestrian volumes or collision history to warrant a STOP sign
- Impacts 6,000+ vehicles per day

Cost: High | Timeframe: Long | Effectiveness: High

Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon



- Increases pedestrian nighttime visibility
- Alerts drivers to unsignalized intersection
- Visual impact on adjacent neighbors

Cost: High | Timeframe: Medium | Effectiveness: High

Raised Crosswalk




- Reduces vehicle speeds
- Increases pedestrian visibility and crossings
- Street grade and drainage issues may limit application

Cost: Medium | Timeframe: Long | Effectiveness: Medium
