- 1. Guest Henry DeRuff from Supervisor Mandelman's office
 - a. PUC update/water main breaks: Henry met with PUC. The majority of water main breaks in San Francisco are on Laidley due to soil conditions. The WWII era pipes were laid on rock with no sand cushion. They are hoping to replace all pipes over time.
 - b. PUC is willing to come to a board meeting or quarterly meeting

3. Approve Minutes (Carolyn W.)

- May 8, 2024 board meeting: Adrienne moved to approve, Heather seconded, 1 abstained, MSA
- b. Approve minutes from special board meeting to endorse Sophie's grant (Heather) Carolyn W moved to approve, Adrienne seconded, MSA.

4. Janet Tarlov, Glen Park Merchants Association

- a. Artwalk: The GPMA is expecting to get a \$10K grant from Avenue Greenway. They are now applying for the street closure permit. The Artwalk organization will focus on the vendors and entertainment. GPA involvement: We had a booth last year and will see if board members are interested in working on the event.
- b. The San Francisco and San Mateo Public Libraries are working together to hold Tricycle Music Festivals, with award winning family friendly bands.

5. Islais Creek Infrastructure Grant (Nicholas)

- a. The SFPUC provides large grants for green infrastructure projects that reduce the risk of storm-water flooding in San Francisco. Nicholas would like Rec and Park to integrate green infrastructure projects into the upper end of Glen Canyon Park in ways that would not only buffer and absorb the stormwater runoff that flows from surrounding streets but also revive the north fork of Islais Creek and enhance the ecosystems within the Park. Nicholas moved that the GPA join other neighborhood groups in a letter to Rec and Park asking them to consider integrating green infrastructure into upper Glen Canyon Park. Adrienne seconded. MSA
- 6. Tree removal near park along O'Shaughnessy. (Heather & Bonnee)
 - a. This is part of a plan to replace aging eucalyptus and pine trees with oaks, as well as create a riparian corridor.
 - b. The eucalyptus trees were all planted 100 years ago and are extremely flammable and prone to falling during storms.
 - c. Replacement oak trees are already being grown. The plan is to plant them at the beginning of the year before bird nesting season begins.
 - d. We will ask SFPUC Land Manager Damon Spigelman, who is in charge of the project, to speak at our January meeting.

- 8. Sunset Cinema on Friday, July 12. Heather and Jamie Ennis will staff the GPA table; Greenway will also have a table.
