Dear Community Challenge Grant Panelists,

The Glen Park Association enthusiastically lends our support to the Bernal Glen Gateway Project which promises to open up an important corridor in our community and to our environment. The association is made up of Glen Park residents who publicize neighborhood concerns and strive to speak as one voice on neighborhood and City issues. We hold regular meetings with City staff, elected officials, planning agencies, and neighboring community groups such as College Hill Neighborhood Association, who are kindred spirits supporting community-driven, grassroots change.

We are excited about the murals that will be created on the Bosworth Street underpass and adjacent Lyell Street wall that supports the freeway infrastructure. The freeway has long divided the neighborhood, and this mural project will transform the underpass into a point of connection. Not only do we hope it will encourage more neighbors from the other side of the freeway to walk west and explore Glen Park Greenway and the treasure that is Glen Canyon Park, but that more people will walk east to enjoy Bernal Cut, a site of historical interest and amazing biodiversity. We are also excited to include people walking portions of the 17-mile Crosstown Trail, which winds through Glen Canyon Park on its way from Candlestick Point to Land's End, so they can discover our neighborhoods.

Recently we hosted a series of Night Markets just off Bosworth and were thrilled to experience the outpouring of support, enthusiasm and dynamism that our merchant corridor deserves. Building events and activities in the neighborhood strengthens our community and brings people out to care for and support our corner of the city. The mural will offer a new landmark to draw in visitors, eyes on the street, vibrancy and foot traffic.

The Bernal Cut Project has significantly improved the hillside view, sense of safety, and quality of life for Glen Park residents living on the Bernal Cut. We will be glad to support this newest expansion of the Project by mobilizing neighbors to participate in the design, execution and future maintenance of the murals. We look forward to closely collaborating with project manager Sophie Constantinou, whose creativity and energetic outreach to neighbors is changing our community for the better each day.
