Pedestrian and Traffic Safety in Glen Park

- San Francisco County Transportation Authority (SFCTA)

Vision Zero represents the City's commitment to creating safer, more livable streets with the goal of eliminating all traffic fatalities and severe injuries. As part of this, SFCTA is studying selected freeway ramps. This is funded through a federal grant, which will help the projects be completed more quickly. Project website:

- Ricardo Olea, SFMTA, City Traffic Engineer and Commander Nicole Jones, SFPD MTA Division
 - Commander Nicole Jones oversees traffic enforcement for SFPD. Ricardo Olea is the lead City Traffic Engineer
 - SFPD works with SFMTA on their traffic enforcement plan. Their 2 priorities are speed and pedestrian safety, focusing on the areas with the most incidents

- 311 is very helpful for logging street complaints. Get the 311 app for your phone
- Public works will be repaving and repainting the I-280 onramp at Bosworth. They are looking into installing a flashing pedestrian sign
- Speeding and congestion on Bosworth was a big issue with the GPA members. Commander Jones committed to speed enforcement on Bosworth
- The dangerous intersection of Elk and Chenery was also discussed, as well as the congestion in downtown Glen Park
